Communication passport



A communication passport is a way of supporting a person with communication difficulties across transitions. It draws together the important information into a practical and person-centred approach. This enables the provision of a clear, positive and consistent approach when supporting the individual, so that they can communicate, learn and develop to the best of their ability.

A Communication Passport does this by:

- Describing the person's preferred method of communication in order to facilitate effective interactions
- Drawing information from the past and present, from many people who know the individual and from different contexts, to help understand the person and to encourage successful interactions.
- Provide a place for the person's own views and preferences to be recorded and drawn to the attention of others
- Place equal value on the views of those who know the individual
- Presenting the person positively as an individual, not as a list of disabilities and difficulties

Passports should be personalised for the individual and the following could be contained:

- All about me
- You need to know
- My Family
- My Friends
- Special people, special things
- Things I like to talk about
- How I communicate
- You can help me communicate
- Fun things I like to do
- Places I like going
- Things I don't like
- I'm working on this...
- Help!
- Eating and Drinking
- What's my eyesight like
- What's my hearing like
