
Hairy reading

Hairy reading is a reading program for children at the reading stage of ages 4-6. It begins with structured phonics, tricky words and letter sounds. Hairy reading is game based and covers foundational pre-reading skills such as; decodable phonics, letter formation and fine motor skill development and develops phonology. This helps to take children beyond blending and develops true understanding of how sounds work together to give automaticity.



Nessy reading and spelling

Nessy reading and spelling covers literacy development from year one to year six. Each student is able to learn at their own pace, with lessons, games and worksheets all available. The programme begins with an assessment to identify where the student needs support and then guides them through an individualised learning plan. It covers lessons from beginning phonics to advanced vocabulary, spelling lists, fluency practice sheets, printable flash cards, videos explaining spelling rules.



Nessy Fingers

Nessy fingers touch typing is a typing and spelling programme for those aged seven and above. Keys are introduced to children in alphabetical order as this is the way that they have been learning, the programme is designed for beginners or those who want to improve their speed after some keyboard experience. It is especially effective for students with Dysgraphia, Dyslexia and ADHD. It covers a set word list from simple to complex but children can add their own spellings as well. Game based, with over 3000 words and sentences the game adapts to the child as they develop and make progress.
